Henrietta Lynelle Young

Henrietta Lynelle Young affectionately known as “Granny” or “Aunt Hennie” was born December 23, 1919 to the late Ollie West and Jimmy Taylor in Palmers Crossing, a neighborhood in Hattiesburg, Mississippi. Her mother later remarried Mr. Robert Moncure who became her stepfather. She was one of four siblings, Ernest, Dorothy, and Willie Pearl (age 99). Granny also had two stepbrothers, Charlie and Tellious. They lived on a Pecan Orchard in Palmers Crossing.

Granny had a relationship with the Lord at an early age. Her grandmother Kathryn West ensured that she and her siblings attended church every Sunday. She attended Priest Creek Baptist Church. She later joined Peoples Community Church in Detroit, Michigan in 1959 and remained a faithful servant. She attended Eureka High School in Mississippi where she graduated at the top of her class. After high school, she migrated to Michigan and began working at Montgomery Ward then later landing a prestigious job as an elevator operator in the Hudson Building. Her greatest job was being a homemaker to her family.

Henrietta was joined in holy matrimony to Ocie Young, Jr. on July 17, 1946, who preceded her death in 1998. From their union, they adopted their only child, Janet Lynelle, who also preceded her in death in 1999. She loved music and taking piano lessons. Granny loved reading the bible and had a “cure” for every ailment. She had a true passion for cooking and baking delicious dishes. She had a bright smile that would warm anyone’s heart and would give her last dollar to anyone in need. Granny loved to travel on numerous road trips with her husband. They loved to take pictures and make home videos. She was an avid bowler and participated in many ladies bowling leagues. Granny believed in keeping

up with technology, so she attended computer classes in her late eighties just so she could send an email. Last year, Granny was able to enjoy her 100th birthday in grand fashion with her family and friends. She was honored that so many people showered her with love and kind words.

Henrietta leaves to cherish and honor her memory; her sister, Willie Pearl Hosey; her grandchildren, Jerry T.
