Clarence W Danzy (CW) was born August 30, 1936 in Deepstep Georgia to the late JC and Irene Danzy. His love of cars and the ability to build them would result in him one day becoming the owner and operator of his own mechanic shop in Detroit Michigan where he worked until his retirement. After retiring he would spend many of his days hanging around at the shop under its new ownership congregating with his many friends that he developed over the years. He always enjoyed holding long conversations talking about cars, racing, politics,

and current events. His gift of conversation and his love of growing up in the south would be the reason for another of his nick names “Country Preacher”. He spent the majority of his pass time traveling, going to the movies, and taking walks in the park with his forever partner, Betty Ann. To their partnership they had two daughters Angela Bell (Christopher) and Tiffany Dye (Lavico Sr.) Betty and CW would spend their golden years continually doing these things until COVID left him without his legs. Betty Ann would spend her days visiting him in the nursing home, Pomeroy Living Sterling Skilled, where he spent his last years. She would bring his favorite foods, and they would watch movies on her portable DVD player. His brother Milton would also visit his brother often. He too brought CW his favorite dishes.

CW was a father of five other children from previous relationships: Lennis, Bridgette Solomon (Clinton), Eric, Reginald (Stephanie) and Sharon (Willie). 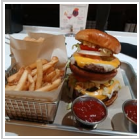
