The youngest of five children Edward Sutton Jr., affectionately known as Ed was born to Edward James and Jainie Thompson Sutton, on February 19th, 1932, in Wilmington, North Carolina. Ed, always being interested in athletics and having a love for numerous sports especially football allowed him to continue his education by receiving a full four-year athletic scholarship to Xavier University in New Orleans, Louisiana.

From 1968 through 1994 Edward served as the first appointed black Executive Director of Don Bosco Hall: Home for Boys. Due to his resolute service at Don Bosco honored him by dedicating one of their new acquisitions that serves as an intensive treatment assisted living facility for youth, in his name called Sutton House. In his last years he was a magnet for family in his infinite wisdom and humor and traveled with his wife, June and sustained his enjoyment of football games and westerns he grew fond of in childhood.
