



Rasul Raheem

October 5, 1957 - June 2, 2024

Rasul Abdul-Raheem was born Mark Harry Slaughter on October 5, 1957 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. He was the 4th of six children born to James Calvin Slaughter and Beverly Green Slaughter.

Rasul's early years were spent growing up in Philadelphia and Washington, DC before his family moved to Ann Arbor, Michigan in 1971. There he attended Forsythe Jr. High and Pioneer High School, excelling in track & field, basketball and football. His most stellar achievements were in football, where he was twice unanimously selected to 1st Team All State and held an unbroken school record in interceptions.

Rasul went on to attend the University of Michigan in Ann Arbor He graduated from Michigan in 1979, after playing football under coach Bo Schembechler from 1975-1976. While at Michigan, he pledged the brotherhood of the Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc. and remained an active alumni member. It was during his time at Michigan that Rasul began to study the religion of Islam, its teachings and beliefs. Embracing the Islamic religion, he became a Muslim and changed his name to Ameen Rasul Musheer Abdul-Raheem, advocate, messenger and servant of God the compassionate one.

After graduating from the University of Michigan, Rasul matriculated to Wayne State University Law School. While attending Wayne State, he met the woman

who would one day become his wife, Antoinette (Toni), the love of his life. After a chance encounter attending a Black Law Student Conference in Detroit, Rasul offered Toni, then a law student in New York, a lift to the airport, as she was flying back to school. The rest, as they say, is history. Antoinette and Rasul wed in 1982. Rasul received his Juris Doctorate from Wayne State in 1984.

After graduating law school, Rasul began his career as an attorney at the Kirk & McCargo law firm. In 1988 Rasul began the legal work that would become the primary focus of his career, banking law, at Bank of America and its predecessors. After practicing law for over 15 years, Rasul returned to Wayne State Law School, this time to pursue his Masters in Law. In December of 2003 Rasul received his Masters in Corporate and Finance Law (LLM). Rasul was also an adjunct law professor, teaching the Law of Banking and Financial Institutions at Cooley Law School starting in 2010. After leaving Bank of America, Rasul worked at the law firms of Plunkett Cooney and Dykema until he attained the position he had long desired as a General Counsel. Rasul worked as a General Counsel at DWSD until his passing.

Rasul was a pillar of his community. He contributed to the legal and broader community with a plethora of volunteer activities, including his service as President of the Augustus Straker Bar Association, on the NBA President's Corporate Advisory Committee, with the Black Alumni of Wayne State Law School, on the National Bar Association Board of Governors, on the Board of Directors of Head Start Detroit, and on the Board of Directors of the Michigan Roundtable for Diversity & Inclusion. Rasul was also appointed by the Mayor of Detroit to the Board of Directors of the Detroit Land Bank Authority. He further served as a hearing panelist for the State of Michigan Attorney Discipline Board.

In addition to being an active member of his beloved fraternity, Kappa Alpha Psi, one of Rasul's greatest passions was his study of Isshinryu karate. Two days before Rasul's passing, he was awarded the 6th degree Black Belt, one of the highest distinctions in karate.

Although Rasul never sought the spotlight or strived for accolades (famous for saying "you just do what you gotta do"), the awards found him nonetheless. Over the course of his career he received many honors including Man of Excellence from the Michigan Chronicle, Integrity Award from Thomas Cooley Law School and Trailblazer of the Year Award from the Augustus Straker Bar Association..

Rasul was always professionally driven, but the happiest times in his life revolved around family. Rasul became a father for the first time in 1982 with the birth of his son, Omar. He welcomed Daira, his first daughter in 1987, and on New Years Day 1993, Rasul's youngest, Alia, was born. Additionally, in 1999 Rasul's niece Jenna became a part of the Raheem family, rounding out the family to a happy six.

A phenomenal coach for many decades, Rasul coached his children and godchildren in soccer, basketball and most notably baseball. When he wasn't busy with the law, driving four kids to three different schools or spending time at the dojo, Rasul was an avid and lifelong fan of Michigan football, an engrossed golfer and a proud dog lover of Sheba, Madison and Rosie.

Rasul answered to a number of titles: Counselor, Dad, Coach, Uncle, Brother, and his favorite, Abu (called by his grandkids). He was all those things and more. He fiercely fought for those people and ideals he loved, he maintained the highest degree of integrity and always reached back to help others pay it forward. He is and was a man for all times who will be sorely missed.

Rasul is survived by his loving wife of forty-two years, Antoinette, his children Omar (Angela), Jenna (David), Daira, and Alia, his grandchildren, Gabriel and Kaia, and his siblings Diane (Frank), Natalie (Norbert), and Matthew, his cousins Linda and Sherri, nieces Kristine (Zach) and Rachel, and nephews Karanja (Kineta) and Aaron, along with a host of other relatives.

Rasul is preceded in death by both his parents, his older brother James Jr., sister-in-law Janice, and sister Kerry.

“*Rasul was my brother for almost fifty years. We met working at Follett’s Bookstore on State Street and North University in the summer of 1975. I was a rising senior, with one semester to go (I graduated early). He had just graduated from Pioneer, and was a recruited walk-on at Michigan. (I remember him telling me that he had been recruited to go to Tennessee and that one of the things he liked about it was that the jersey were open midriff so the players could show off their abs. He may not have said “show off their abs;” maybe it was that not having to tuck in a jersey made you feel freer, but I really do think it was that he wanted to show off his abs.)*

So I was this skinny smart kid from the Detroit suburbs, always an athlete wannabe, but never an athlete and he was this – and I say this without any implication other than the documented fact – beautiful and really cool football player going to play at Michigan. When I say beautiful and documented fact – the photography studio on Liberty Street that did the Pioneer senior pictures used the picture I’ve posted in the “Rasul and Jeff” album in the front window as an advertisement. For what it’s worth, the second picture is what I looked like, the main point being how much hair we both had in 1975, and it’s part of the joke that comes later in this post.

In my senior year, I was applying to law school. I was accepted at Michigan, but after four years there, I wanted to go somewhere else, but we talked, if I had stayed, about rooming together. But I went off to the West Coast.

Over the next couple years, his dad passed away, he quit the football team, and when my then fiancée Alene and I saw him in Ann Arbor over the summer, he seemed lost and unhappy. We hung out on the northwest corner of the Diag, and I don’t remember the sequence, but he was talking about Muhammad Ali and how much he admired him, and Alene and I were browsing at Borders on State Street, and there was a copy of Ali’s autobiography “The Greatest” on the remainder table. I bought it and gave it to him.

The next time I talked to him several months later, he told me that had triggered something in him, that he had embraced Islam, and changed his name to Rasul Abdul-Raheem. And he was going to law school at Wayne.

I will skip ahead and let someone else talk about how he met and how he worshiped Toni. For me, over the next forty-five years or so, rarely did several weeks go by without one of us calling the other, just to talk about careers, Michigan football, politics, or anything. Every call started with "Hey, what's going on?" and no other identification. And we grew to be grumpy old men together.

Ten years ago, when he was still at BoA in Troy, I came into Detroit and Ann Arbor to participate in the Michigan Football Experience. I stopped in Troy and we had lunch at Somerset. When you see the picture I've posted in "Rasul and Jeff," please understand that I got dressed that morning in Cambridge, Massachusetts, he got dressed in Southfield, Michigan, and we did not discuss beforehand our attire for the day.

And there's a picture in the album of all of us (clearly before) the disastrous MSU game in 2015.

I was incredibly proud of his going to my old law firm (from 30+ years ago), Dykema, and all the honors and accolades he got.

I'm writing this down because it's how I deal with stuff like this, but there was no person outside my family who I was closer to in my life. He was a smart, sensible man of impeccable integrity. Toni, Omar, Daira, Alia, and Jenna meant everything to him. One of the things we talked about from time to time was how lucky each of us was to meet and marry someone who anchored our lives and caused us to be the men and the fathers we became (and I think we were pretty good if his and my children are any indication).
