*Comment from a descendent of
MOSES ARTHUR (Cap) MEREDITH*

I grew up in Detroit, far away from my family in Kosciusko, Mississippi. Even with the great distance between us, my Grandfather Moses (Cap) Meredith, was always discussed; he was described as a very proud man, tall in stature, headstrong and diligent in teaching his children and grandchildren to be proud of their black skin. Their pigment did not make them less than their white counterparts. Cap was an unusual Black man in the south. He purchased his own land and started voting in 1923. He ran a self-sustaining farm and raised his ten children. Cap made sure his children weren't affected by their prejudiced white next-door neighbors. My grandfather's legacy lives on and I'm proud Moses (Cap) Meredith was my grandfather.

Terry Lynn Meredith Street, Daughter of Emmett Meredith, Moses and Barbara's first born.

Emmett was seven years old when his parents moved he, his younger brother Leroy, their baby sister Delma, and the infant girl Thelma on the farm. Owning property expanded the educational opportunities for the Meredith children. Emmett completed the 11th grade at Attala County Training School in 1934 which was as far as the school went that year; the following year he obtained a 12th grade education from CM& I College reaching a remarkable milestone because there were over 177,000 illiterate Negroes in Mississippi.
